The highest paying foreign languages for English native speakers are Spanish, French, Mandarin Chinese, German and Arabic.

## Reading Examination

45 minutes (Foundation tier)
1 hour (Higher tier)
$25 \%$ of qualification
You will have a text to read with a task to show understanding, including one translation task from Spanish into English.

## Listening Examination

35 minutes (Foundation tier)
45 minutes (Higher tier)
$25 \%$ of qualification

You will listen to a recording and complete different types of tasks, just like we do in class. You will also have a short dictation.

## Writing Examination

1 hour 10 minutes (Foundation tier)
1 hour 15 minutes (Higher tier)
$25 \%$ of qualification

Writing tasks including one translation task from English into Spanish.
